The 21st Anniversary of the Death of Sister Mildred Mary Neuzil January 10, 2021

My Son is in love with your lowliness and simplicity of heart.

Sweet child, beloved of my Son and cherished by me, my message has not been heeded nor have I yet found one to further the cause of renewal within. The Presence of the trinity within every human being is the focal point, the basis of interior holiness. From this will spring a deep life of prayer and a love for penance as the discipline needed to convert all peoples to a serious preparation for the coming of my Son. ...

Beloved daughter, you are not being accepted because you are a small one. But in the end all will come as I desire. Those who oppose you will receive light to understand. These good people mean well and if they are in authority it is for you to listen respectfully and obey. I will speak to them in their hearts and the Divine Spirit who makes all things clear will give them wisdom and understanding. In the end they will do as I wish. So, have patience, dear one, it will happen as I have said and those who have opposed

me will become my most ardent and courageous supporters. Until this comes to pass, wait in trust, knowing that I never fail those who place their confidence in me. My Son blesses you, be at peace.

(Sister Mildred Mary Neuzil, The Diary, OUR LADY OF AMERICA, Pg. 37, August 14, 1980.)

Our Lady spoke these words of encouragement to Sister Mildred in 1980, almost twenty-four years after her first appearance. Sister was becoming frustrated, as so many of us are today, that no bishop had come forth to champion Our Lady's cause. In 1960, Bishop Leibold had directed Sister to submit her manuscript of Our Lady's messages to Bishop Joseph Marling, C.PP.S., Bishop George J. Rehring, Toledo, Ohio, ordinary of the diocese in which she lived, Archbishop Karl J. Altar, Cincinnati, Ohio, the diocese of her Motherhouse, and Bishop Clarence Issenmann, Columbus, Ohio. None of these bishops



expressed concern over its contents at the time. In 1981, Fr. Edmund Morman, Sister's second spiritual director after the death of Archbishop Leibold in 1972, had Sister add to her Diary Our Lady's messages that continued until January 3,1984, the final message, and copyright them with the Library of Congress. None of these later messages were considered in the law suit nor in the bishops' study and are not in public domain but are copyright protected from infringement. Only this original site of the sisters has the legal right to print the *entire* Diary and can, therefore, faithfully protect the integrity of the whole message as given to Sister by Our Lady. Considering what an enormous favor this apparition of Our Lady is for her children in America and to the

Church in America, a land dedicated to the Immaculate Conception, it is difficult to understand the lack of concern among our bishops with respect to the urgency Our Lady gave this message for the spiritual renewal of the Church, of America and of the world. It is a call to return to Faith and Purity, to protect marriage and family life, and life itself, through the focus on the Divine Indwelling of the Most Holy Trinity as the source of our holiness from within, so necessary for our salvation.

On September 19, 1980, Our Lady spoke of Sister's spiritual director:

Dear child, I give my blessing and that of my Son for whose glory I work and intercede, upon my faithful and devoted priest-son, Edmund, my beloved daughter, Clara, and all who help to promote my cause which is also that of my Son, Jesus, for peace among the Father's family of children which encompasses the whole world. Tell my faithful ones this to give them courage. I am pleased with their effort and stand by them at all times. (The Diary, Pg. 38.)

Beloved daughter, the United States is a small one among nations, yet has it not been said that 'a little one shall lead them'? It is the United States that is to lead the world to peace, the peace

of Christ, the peace that He brought with Him from heaven in His birth as man in the little town of Bethlehem. The Savior did not come to enter this world in a big city but a small town, again, a little one among many. Dear child, unless the United States accepts and carries out faithfully the mandate given to it by heaven to lead the world to peace, there will come upon it and all nations a great havoc of war and incredible suffering. If, however, the United States is faithful to this mandate from heaven and yet fails in the pursuit of peace because the rest of the world will not accept or co-operate then the United States will not be burdened with the punishment about to fall. (The Diary, Pg. 38, Nov. 22, 1980.)

Sister was worried that the responsibility of leadership would be too great for the United States, but Our Lady promised the help of St. Michael and the whole army of angels, for as Queen of Angels, they do her bidding. Our Lady also warned that many live by human wisdom that is not saturated with Divine Wisdom; this is dangerous and leads to wrong paths of darkness where the only light is false like a mirage in the desert.

Dear child, the danger is imminent, there is no time to lose. Tell my faithful ones who are working so diligently for my cause that I am most grateful but urge them to do all in their power to continue even in the midst of sacrifice and suffering. They will not be alone in their struggle. Myself, with the holy angels, will be always with them to help fight and encourage. Get this message to them quickly as the time is shorter than ever. (The Diary, Pg. 39.)

Sister exhorted all of us to do our part, for we know the sacrifices expected of us,

and we have nothing to fear if we do our part. Our Lady asked that we pray the family rosary with as many family members as possible, and pray The Prayer to the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of the United States, one or more times a day, for the protection of our beloved nation. She warned the "Forces of Evil" are enveloping the world and are focused on the United States because of this Divine Mandate to lead the world to peace. She said: ... "evil



is so insidious that it often passes for good. The simple and pure of heart alone can detect the difference. Many good works and many a good person or persons are thwarted and destroyed by apparently good people who are manipulated by the powers of evil because they do not possess that finer sense of being able to detect a false spirit from a true one." (The Diary, Pgs. 39-40.)

Jesus Himself then spoke to the unnatural acts, committed in the name of love, being disguised as intrinsic rights like any other.

"Many unnatural acts are being committed in the name of love. This evil is being disguised




and tolerated as an intrinsic right like any other. Even some of my priests and consecrated virgins are being caught up into this web of evil, not realizing its terrible consequences.... many false doctrines are being taught and for many the true Christ is never made known. The false prophets and self-proclaimed Messiahs are drawing many away from Me, the Way, the Truth and the Life. I am the true Messiah who was sent and the only one proclaimed as such by My Father. Seek Me for I only am truth, I only am the Christ." (The Diary, Pg. 40, our Lord, July 13, 1981.)

[Sister Mildred relates Christ's words when He calls her His little white dove.] "My Heart speaks to the humble. It is they who hear My Voice. Be humble My children, be humble and pure of heart. Then will I come and dwell with you. My little white dove, how humility and simplicity are despised by the proud of this world. Oh what a loss they suffer. For despising the humble Christ will judge them." (Letter to Father Leibold).

[In a 1954 letter to Father Leibold, Sister relates Christ's words for both of them:] "I seek

always the humble and lowly of heart and since I have found two such, so I have entrusted to them a great mission, but become not vain, for I have chosen him and you only because of your unworthiness and lack of virtue. Let this thought be with you always, that you may remember that it is I working through you, Who sanctify you for His glory and the salvation of souls. You are poor instruments in My Hands, but through you a Great Work will be accomplished.



I am the Great Sculptor of souls. With hammer and chisel I form them that they may glorify My Father by their beauty and perfection. Be pliant in My Hands, oh My two lowly ones, My chosen priest and My little white



[In a 1957 letter Sister records Our Lady's words:] "Fear not, small one, for it is through the most unlikely of instruments that God works His wonders. He chooses where the world would not. He makes that possible which the world

deems impossible. ...God has no need of anyone, yet He chooses the smallest of the small for His glory. Sweet child, let your humble heart be filled with a great confidence, for my Son is in love with your lowliness and simplicity of heart. Make known to souls the preference my Son has for humility."

...it was for this I was born and for this I must spend myself. I will always be a nothing, yet a nothing full of confidence in Him Who chooses the foolish things of this world to confound the wise and the weak things of this world to confound the strong. For it is not right that flesh should glory in His sight. How happy I am to be such a nothing, to be counted as nought. "Hide me away, my God, I am only fit to be hidden away in some dark corner, unseen by anyone but You."
